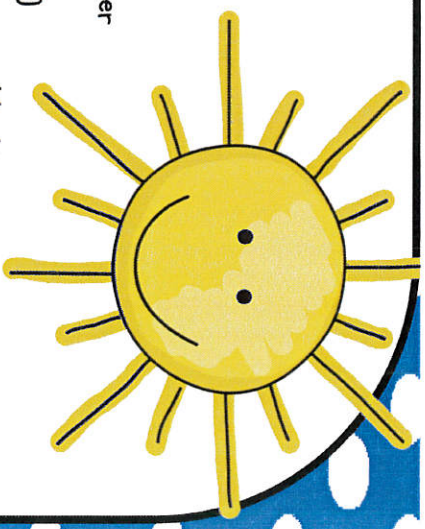


Keep your 2nd Grader's Skills Sharp this Summer
