


Culture of Philanthropy





FOCUS ON ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

During the 2023-2024 school year, our students continued to excel and consistently surpassed the standards of both private and public schools across the nation.











SECOND PLACE OVERALL IN SCISA REGIONAL SPELLING BEE

(4th grade) scored in the top 10 in their age brackets.
