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## **1. Receiving Your iPad/Chromebook & Check-In**

### 1.1 Receiving Your iPad/Chromebook

iPad/Chromebooks will be distributed each fall. Before receiving an iPad/Chromebook, students and parents must sign and return copies of the following documents:

- Student Pledge for iPad/Chromebook Use and Acceptable Use Policy (part of the School Handbook)

### 1.2 iPad/Chromebook Check-in and Checkout

iPad/Chromebooks will be returned during the final week of school during student checkout, so they can be examined for serviceability. If students transfer out of Addlestone Hebrew Academy during the school year, their iPad/Chromebook will be returned at that time.

### 1.3 Check-In Fines

Individual school iPad/Chromebooks and accessories must be returned to Addlestone Hebrew Academy at the end of each school year. Students who withdraw, are suspended or expelled, or terminate enrollment at AHA for any other reason must return their iPad/Chromebook on the date of termination. If a student fails to return the iPad/Chromebook at the end of the school year or upon termination of enrollment, that student may be subject to criminal prosecution or civil liability. The student's parent or guardian will pay the cost of the iPad/Chromebook. Failure to return the iPad/Chromebook will result in a theft report being filed with the Charleston County Sheriff Department.

## **2. Taking Care of your iPad/Chromebook**

Students are responsible for the general care of the iPad/Chromebook they have been issued by the school. iPad/Chromebooks that are broken or fail to work properly must be taken to the IT office for an evaluation of the equipment.

### 2.1 General Precautions

The iPad/Chromebook is school property and all users will follow the policy and the Acceptable Use Policy for technology.

- Only use a clean, soft cloth to clean the screen, use no cleaners of any type.
- Cords and cables must be inserted carefully into the iPad/Chromebook to prevent damage.
- iPad/Chromebooks and cases must remain free of any writing, drawing, stickers, or labels that are not the property of AHA.
- iPad/Chromebooks must never be left in an unattended or unsupervised area.
- Students are responsible for keeping their iPad/Chromebook's battery charged.
- Students are to return their iPad/Chromebook to the charging cart at the end of each day. Charging carts are available all day long.

- Students must keep their iPad/Chromebook in the protective case, provided by the school at all times.

## 2.2 Carrying iPad/Chromebooks

The protective keyboard case provided with the iPad/Chromebooks has sufficient padding to protect the iPad/Chromebook from normal treatment and provide a suitable means for carrying the device within the school.

Guidelines below should be followed:

- iPad/Chromebooks must always be within the protective case.
- **Limit the number of items carried within a backpack with the iPad/Chromebook to limit the amount of pressure applied to the iPad/Chromebook screen.**
- Avoid bumping the iPad/Chromebook against any surface.
- It is advised to carry the device by walking and using 2 hands.

## 2.3 Screen Care

The iPad/Chromebook screens can be damaged if subjected to rough treatment.

The screens are particularly sensitive to damage from excessive pressure on the screen.

- Do not lean on the top of the iPad/Chromebook at any time.
- Do not place anything near the iPad/Chromebook that could put pressure on the screen.
- Clean the screen with a soft, dry cloth or anti-static cloth. Use of any cleaning chemicals is prohibited as they WILL damage the screen.

# **4. Protecting and Storing Your iPad/Chromebook**

## 4.1 iPad/Chromebook Identification

Student iPad/Chromebooks will be labeled in the manner specified by the school.

iPad/Chromebooks can be identified in the following ways:

- Record of serial numbers and correlated asset tag.
- Addlestone Hebrew Academy label.

## 4.2 Storing Your iPad/Chromebook

When students are not using their iPad/Chromebooks, they should be stored in their locker or kept with the student. Nothing should be placed on top of the iPad/Chromebook when stored in student lockers.

**Do NOT leave your iPad/Chromebook in a place that is experiencing extreme hot or cold conditions. Extreme heat will damage the unit itself and extreme cold will cause severe screen damage.**

#### 4.3 iPad/Chromebooks Left in Unsupervised Areas

Under no circumstances should iPad/Chromebooks be left in unsupervised areas. Unsupervised areas include school grounds, lunchroom, auditorium, unlocked classrooms, hallways, etc. any iPad/Chromebook left in these areas is in danger of being stolen or damaged. If an iPad/Chromebook is found in an unsupervised area, it will be taken to the office. Violations may result in loss of iPad/Chromebook privileges and/or other privileges.

### **3. Using Your iPad/Chromebook at School**

iPad/Chromebooks are intended for use in the classroom at school each day. In addition to teacher expectations for iPad/Chromebook use, school messages, announcements, calendars and schedules may be accessed using the iPad/Chromebook. Students must be responsible to bring their iPad/Chromebook to all classes, unless specifically instructed not to do so by their teacher.

The iPad/Chromebook is the property of Addlestone Hebrew Academy, therefore, school staff and administration have the right to check any material stored on a student's iPad/Chromebook at any time. iPad/Chromebooks are not to be used in the hallway during transition time, brought outside to the playground during recess or into the restroom.

#### 3.1 iPad/Chromebooks Left at home

If students leave their iPad/Chromebook at home, they are responsible for getting the course work completed as if they had their iPad/Chromebook present.

#### 3.2 iPad/Chromebooks Undergoing Repair

Loaner iPad/Chromebooks may be issued to students when they leave their iPad/ Chromebooks for repair in the office. There may be a delay in getting an iPad/ Chromebook should the school not have enough to loan.

#### 3.3 Charging your iPad/Chromebook's Battery

iPad/Chromebooks and keyboards will be fully charged each morning. Students need to charge their iPad/Chromebooks each at the end of the school day. Only charge your iPad/Chromebook with the provided charger.

#### 3.4 Screensavers and Backgrounds

Each device comes with its own screensaver that includes the Addlestone name as well as the student's name. Inappropriate media may not be used as a screensaver or background photo. The presence of guns, weapons, pornographic materials, inappropriate language, alcohol, drug, tobacco, and gang related symbols or pictures will result in disciplinary actions.

### 3.5 Sounds, Music, Games, or Programs

Sounds must be muted at all times unless permission is obtained from the teacher for instructional purposes. Music is allowed on iPad/Chromebook and can be used at the discretion of the teacher.

All software/apps provided by AHA must remain on the iPad/Chromebook. Data storage will be through apps on the iPad/Chromebook and email to a server location. Internet games are not allowed on iPad/Chromebooks.

### 3.6 Printing

Printing is only available with teacher permission to the printers available in the student common areas.

### 3.7 Home Internet Access

Students are allowed to set up wireless networks on the iPad/Chromebooks. This will assist them with iPad/Chromebook use while at home. Printing at home will require the student to follow the same steps as printing at school.

### 3.8 Apple ID and Personal Email Accounts:

No Parent or student Apple ID or personal email accounts should be installed on the iPads/Chromebooks.

## **4. Managing Your Files & Saving Your Work**

### 4.1 Saving Your Work

Students may save all work to Google Drive. Storage space will be available on the iPad/Chromebook – but it will not be backed up in case of re-imaging. It is the student's responsibility to ensure work is not lost due to mechanical failure or accidental deletion. iPad/Chromebook malfunctions are not acceptable excuses for not submitting work.

### 4.2 Network Connectivity

Addlestone Hebrew Academy makes no guarantee that the network will be up and running 100% of the time. In the rare case the network is down, the school will not be responsible for lost or missing data.

## **5. Software on iPad/Chromebooks**

### 5.1 Originally Installed Software

The software/apps originally installed by Addlestone Hebrew Academy must remain on the iPad/Chromebook in usable condition and be easily accessible at all times. From time to time the

school may add software applications for use in a particular course. The licenses for this software require that the software be deleted from iPad/Chromebooks at the completion of the course. Periodic checks of iPad/Chromebooks will be made to ensure that students have not removed required apps.

### 5.2 Inspection

Students may be selected at random to provide their iPad/Chromebook for inspection. These inspections may include an inspection of all material saved on the iPad/ Chromebook.

### 5.3 Procedure for Re-loading Software

If technical difficulties occur from illegal software or non-AHA installed apps are discovered, the iPad/Chromebook will be restored from backup to its original state. The school does not accept responsibility for the loss of any software or documents deleted due to reformat and reimage.

### 5.4 Software Upgrades

Upgraded versions of licensed software/apps are available from time to time. Students will be required to check in their iPad/Chromebooks for periodic updates and syncing.

### 5.5 Self Service App

All approved apps are distributed through self service. Teachers will let IT know what apps are needed and they will be made available upon request.

### 5.6 Google Apps

All students are assigned an @addlestone.org email address.

Format: first initial last name aha graduation year@addlestone .org.

Password: iPad1234 for grades K-3. Grades 4-8 will create their own passwords

Ex: Username: hjohnsonaha2026@addlestone.org

Password: iPad1234

Teachers will use student email addresses for communication, Google classrooms, and other school approved third party apps and services.

## **6. Acceptable Use Policy**

The use of Addlestone Hebrew Academy technology resources is a privilege, not a right. This privilege is not transferable or extendable by students to people or groups outside the school and terminates when a student is no longer enrolled at Addlestone Hebrew Academy. This policy is provided to make all users aware of the responsibilities associated with the efficient, ethical, and lawful use of technology resources. If a person violates any of the terms and conditions named in this policy, privileges may be terminated, access to school technology resources may be denied, and appropriate disciplinary action will be applied.

Violations may result in disciplinary actions up to and including suspension or expulsion for students.

When applicable, law enforcement agencies may be involved, and some acts described in this policy may be punishable under South Carolina and Federal law.

## 6.1 Responsibilities

### **6.1.a Parent/Guardian Responsibilities**

Parents/guardians are encouraged to discuss values and standards for Internet use with their children, just as they do for other media information sources such as television, telephones, movies, and radio.

Should you want your student to opt out of having an iPad/Chromebook, you must sign a letter indicating this, stating your reason(s), and understand that your student is still responsible for meeting all course requirements.

### **6.1.b School Responsibilities**

The school will provide Internet and email access to its students and will provide Internet blocking of inappropriate materials where possible. The school will provide network data storage areas, which will be treated similarly to school lockers. Addlestone Hebrew Academy reserves the right to review, monitor, and restrict information stored on or transmitted via school-owned equipment and to investigate inappropriate use of resources.

Additionally, the school will provide training on how to appropriately use the iPad/Chromebook and will offer staff guidance to aid students in research and ensure student compliance with iPad/Chromebook policies and procedures.

### **6.1.c Student General Responsibilities**

Students will use iPad/Chromebooks/computers in a responsible and ethical manner. Students will obey general school rules concerning behavior and communication that apply to iPad/Chromebook/computer use.

Students will use all technology resources appropriately to avoid damaging school equipment.

- This “damage” includes, but is not limited to, the loss of data resulting from delays, non-deliveries, miss-deliveries, or service interruptions caused by the student’s own negligence, errors, or omissions.

Students acknowledge that the use of any information obtained via Addlestone Hebrew Academy’s designated internet system is at their own risk, and Addlestone Hebrew Academy specifically denies any responsibility for the accuracy or quality of information obtained through its services.

Students will help Addlestone Hebrew Academy protect its computer system/devices by contacting an administrator about any security problems they may encounter and by monitoring all activity on their account(s).

If a student receives an email containing inappropriate or abusive language or if the

subject matter is questionable, they are asked to print a copy and turn it in to the administration.

Students should always turn off and secure their iPad/Chromebook after they are done working to protect their work and information.

Students will return their iPad/Chromebook to the school at the end of each school year. Students who withdraw, are suspended or expelled, or terminate enrollment at Addlestone Hebrew Academy for any other reason must return their individual school iPad/Chromebook on the date of termination.

## **6.2 Student Internet, iPad/Chromebook, and Computer Use Guidelines**

Students are expected to use iPad/Chromebooks, computers, and the Internet as an educational resource. The following procedures and guidelines govern the use of these technology resources at school.

### **Acceptable Use for Students**

Students may use the Internet and school technology resources for the following appropriate educational purposes:

- To conduct research assigned by teachers.
- To conduct research for classroom projects.
- To gain access to information about current events.
- To conduct research for school-related activities.

### **Unacceptable Use for Students**

Students shall not use school computers, iPad/Chromebooks, or the Internet for any of the following prohibited activities:

#### ***Content-Related Prohibitions:***

- Gaining access to, sending, accessing, uploading, downloading, or distributing material that is obscene, pornographic, offensive, profane, threatening, sexually explicit, harmful to minors, or otherwise inappropriate for educational uses.
- Transmission or accessing materials that are offensive, threatening, or otherwise intended to harass or demean recipients.
- Using the iPad/Chromebook camera to take and/or distribute inappropriate or unethical material.

#### ***Communication-Related Prohibitions:***

- Using chat rooms, instant messaging, messaging services (e.g., Google Chat, WhatsApp, Discord), or other forms of direct electronic or anonymous/false communications.
- Sending mass or inappropriate emails (spamming).
- Forging electronic mail messages or web pages.
- Disclosing personal information, such as names, school addresses, or telephone numbers,

for any reason over the Internet, including but not limited to setting up Internet accounts necessary for chat rooms, eBay, email, etc.

#### *Illegal & Unethical Activity Prohibitions:*

- Engaging in any illegal or inappropriate activities.
- Illegal installation or transmission of copyrighted materials, or downloading and copying of copyrighted material without permission.
- Using school Internet/email accounts for financial or commercial gain, or for any illegal activity.
- Participating in online auctions, online gaming, or mp3 sharing systems (including, but not limited to, Aimster or Freenet and the like).
- Using sites selling term papers, book reports, and other forms of student work.
- Participating in credit card fraud, electronic forgery, or other forms of illegal behavior.
- Any action that violates existing Board policy or public law.

#### *System & Device Interference Prohibitions:*

- Vandalism: Any malicious attempt to harm or destroy hardware, software, or data, including, but not limited to, the uploading or creation of computer viruses or computer programs that can infiltrate computer systems and/or damage software components. This includes writing, producing, generating, copying, propagating, or attempting to introduce any computer code designed to self-replicate, damage, or otherwise hinder the performance of any computer's memory, file system, or software (e.g., a bug, virus, worm, or Trojan Horse).
- Erasing, renaming, or making unusable anyone else's computer files, programs, or disks.
- Gaining access to another student's accounts, files, and/or data.
- Sharing passwords with fellow students, school volunteers, or any other individuals, or attempting to use or discover another user's password.
- Copying, changing, or transferring any software or documentation provided by the school, teachers, or another student without permission from the system administrator.
- Using outside data disks or external attachments without prior approval from the administration.
- Changing iPad/Chromebook settings (exceptions include personal settings such as font size, brightness, etc.).
- Configuring or troubleshooting computers, networks, printers, or other associated equipment, except as directed by a teacher or the system administrator.
- Taking home technology equipment (hardware or software) without permission of the system administrator.

### 6.3 iPad/Chromebook Care

Students will be held responsible for maintaining their individual iPad/Chromebooks and keeping them in good working order. Students will be responsible for damages to their iPad/Chromebooks.

- iPad/Chromebook batteries/keyboards must be charged and ready for school each day.

- Only labels or stickers applied by Addlestone Hebrew Academy may be applied to the iPad/Chromebook.
- iPad/Chromebook cases furnished by the school must be returned with only normal wear and no alterations to avoid paying a case replacement fee.
- iPad/Chromebooks that malfunction or are damaged must be turned into IT. The school will be responsible for repairing iPad/Chromebooks that malfunction.
- iPad/Chromebooks that have been intentionally damaged from student misuse or neglect will be repaired with the cost being borne by the student. Students will be responsible for the entire cost of repairs to iPad/Chromebooks that are damaged intentionally or be responsible for full replacement cost.
- iPad/Chromebooks that are stolen or lost must be reported immediately to the office and to the police.

#### 6.4 Legal Propriety

Students are expected to comply with trademark and copyright laws and all license agreements. Ignorance of the law is not immunity; if students are unsure, they should ask a teacher or parent.

Plagiarism is viewed as a form of cheating and is a violation of Addlestone Hebrew Academy policy. Students must give credit to all sources used, whether quoted or summarized. This includes all forms of media on the internet, such as graphics, movies, music, and text.

Use or possession of hacking software is strictly prohibited, and violators will be subject to disciplinary action. Violation of applicable state or federal law may result in criminal prosecution and/or disciplinary action by the school.

#### 6.5 Enforcement

The school monitors all Internet communications, Internet usage, and patterns of Internet usage. Students have no right of privacy to any Internet communications or other electronic files. The iPad/Chromebook and computer system are owned by the school; as with any school property, any electronic files on the system are subject to search and inspection at any time.

The school uses a technology protection measure that blocks access to some Internet sites that are not in accordance with the policy of the school. Standard use of the Internet utilizes a proxy server-based filter that screens for non-curriculum related pages. Due to the nature of filtering technology, the filter may at times block pages that are appropriate for student research. The system administrator may override the technology protection measure for the student to access a site with legitimate educational value that is wrongly blocked.

School staff will monitor students' use of the Internet through direct supervision and by monitoring Internet use history to ensure enforcement of policy.

#### 6.6 Student Discipline

If a student violates any part of the above policy, he or she will be subject to consequences as

listed on the following page. .

## INFRACTIONS AND CONSEQUENCES

If a student does not meet behavior expectations and responsible use, they may be moved up a level of operation. Operational levels are also based on overall student performance.

Considerations include completion of assignments, classroom behavior, meeting expectations, and referrals. The administration reserves the right to deny students access to iPad/Chromebooks at its discretion both inside and outside of school.

## 7. Repairing or Replacing your iPad/Chromebook

Students will be responsible for damages to their iPad/Chromebooks including, but not limited to, broken screens, cracked plastic pieces, inoperability, etc. depending on the damage and whether or not the damage was accidental or due to a malfunction or maintenance issue, the Addlestone Hebrew Academy Protection Plan would be used to determine the cost of the repairs. In the case of intentional damage and/or neglect, the student will pay for repair or replacement cost of the device.

### 7.1 Addlestone Hebrew Academy Usage Fee

Addlestone Hebrew Academy requires a usage fee each school year. The cost of the fee for students in Kindergarten-4<sup>th</sup> grade is \$25 and middle school grades 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> is \$35 per student annually. The usage fee covers one iPad/Chromebook per student per school year for any costs outside the manufacturer's warranty. This fee is included in the All-inclusive Infrastructure and Tech Fee that is part of each student's tuition. The usage fee covers repairs to iPads or Chromebooks. Refer to the following coverage table for repair costs without the usage fee.

#### **Replacement Costs for peripheral replacement are as follows:**

- iPad/Chromebook charging brick- \$49.00
- USB-Lightening Charge Cable- \$29.00
- USB C Cables- \$10.00
- Keyboard case- \$25.00

### 7.2 Claims

All protection plan claims for accidental damage or maintenance must be reported and filed with the office. In cases of theft or loss, students or parents must file a police or fire report and bring a copy of the report to the office before an iPad/Chromebook can be replaced by the protection plan.

## **Policies and Procedures for 1:1 iPad/Chromebook Program**

Addlestone Hebrew Academy is proud to offer our AHA students Apple iPad/Chromebook devices for use at school. The 1:1 iPad/Chromebook Program, which provides mobile computing and wireless technology to AHA, has been designed to enhance delivery and individualization of instruction.

For students and parents/guardians, the following information is provided to help everyone understand the expectations and the responsibility of care and use related to receiving an iPad/Chromebook.

- Students will receive instruction from school staff on the proper use of the iPad/Chromebook.
- Students will only be able to take the iPad/Chromebook home during the school year upon parent or teacher request (Grades 6-8) releasing AHA from all responsibilities when in parent care.
- Students are expected to treat the iPad/Chromebook as a valuable piece of equipment.
- Students must take all precautions to prevent theft and damage, for example, do not leave the iPad/Chromebook where there is danger of encountering moisture or excessive heat.
- The iPad/Chromebook comes with preloaded apps which must not be removed. Students will not be able to load additional apps onto the machine while following the guidelines of Acceptable Use Policy.
- Students are to use iPad/Chromebook access only for educational appropriate materials and websites.
- Students must not use the iPad/Chromebook to purchase goods and services via the Internet. (Parents/students are charged with full responsibility for any financial obligations incurred from the inappropriate use of the iPad/Chromebook.)
- Students are to use iPad/Chromebook in accordance with AHA Acceptable Use Regulations and to maintain the iPad/Chromebook in accordance with this policy and procedure, and additional directions from AHA staff.
- Students are expected to adhere to any requirements set forth from the classroom teacher.
- iPad/Chromebooks are the property of Addlestone Hebrew Academy and must be returned at the end of the academic year, upon withdrawal from AHA, or at the request of a teacher or administrator. Willful failure to return the iPad/Chromebook in accordance with the stated conditions will result in criminal prosecution.
- Since the iPad/Chromebooks are the property of Addlestone Hebrew Academy, officials of the school have the right to review all material stored on or accessed by any iPad/Chromebook. School officials may revoke a student's iPad/Chromebook privileges for misuse or violation of policies.

The 1:1 iPad/Chromebook initiative, which has been adopted by Addlestone Hebrew Academy, will enhance learning for our students using 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills. Learning results from continuous dynamic interaction among students, educators, parents, and the extended community. Effective teaching and learning with iPad/ Chromebooks integrate technology into the curriculum anytime, anyplace.

# 2026-2027 Student Pledge for iPad & Chromebook Use

Using a school issued iPad or Chromebook is a privilege and not right. **Addlestone Hebrew Academy iPad/Chromebooks are school property and must be used responsibly.**

**As a student, I pledge to:**

## **Care & Handling:**

- Protect my device by keeping it in the provided case at all times.
- Do not remove the device from its case.
- Keep food and drinks away from the device.
- Do not disassemble or attempt to repair the device.
- Do not place decorations (stickers, markers) on the device or case.
- Do not deface the serial number sticker.
- Charge your device and keyboard daily; arrive at school with them fully charged.

## **Security & Supervision:**

- Never leave my device unattended.
- Never loan my device to others.
- Always know where my device is.

## **Appropriate Use:**

- Use the device for educational purposes and in ways that meet school expectations.
- Use appropriate language in all electronic communications (emails, journals, wikis, etc).
- Do not create or encourage discourteous, abusive, or harmful content (rumors, gossip).
- Do not use the camera to take or distribute inappropriate or unethical material.
- Follow all policies in the "1:1 iPad/Chromebook Policies and Procedures" document, both at school and outside of school hours.

## **Damage, Loss & Reporting:**

- I am responsible for all damages or loss caused by neglect or abuse.
